

Visit the New York-New Jersey Trail Conference Headquarters at the historic Darlington Schoolhouse!

In April 2015, the Trail Conference officially completed the move into their new headquarters at the Darlington Schoolhouse in Mahwah, NJ. The Trail Conference has worked with many partners since 2004 to acquire, stablize, restore, and repurpose the 124-year-old historical landmark, which borders the Ramapo Valley Reservation and now helps to serve the organization's goal of protecting and promoting access to the outdoors.

Everyone is invited to stop by the headquarters to purchase maps, books, trail gear and memberships, sign up for volunteer opportunities and workshops, or simply learn more about the organization. From the Ramapo Valley Reservation parking lot, a short path near the parking lot entrance provides direct walking access to the headquarters.

You can now download our Ramapo Valley Reservation trail map on your Apple or Android device through the **Avenza Maps** app. This enhanced trail map uses GPS to pinpoint your location, tracks movements in real time, does not require mobile cell coverage to use, and offers many other functions. The Trail Conference offers a large selection of both free and for-sale maps through the app, and as with our print maps, funds received from app map sales support our trail work in the region.

Note that these digital maps are not meant to be a replacement for printed maps, so we certainly suggest you carry printed maps just in case.
